



We've made significant strides in the right direction, and I'm excited about the progress we've made. January

The start of 2025 was marked by significant progress for the Foundation as we focused on strengthening and expanding our network of collaborators.



On 13 January, I had the privilege of meeting with the Chief Librarian of Cape Town Central Library, Rosalind alongside Hendricks, Senior Librarian Razaan Khan. This meeting was the beginning of an important conversation about how the Foundation and the Library could work together to serve the community effectively.

Following this initial engagement, I met in person with Razaan Khan again on 25 January at the library. During this visit, I was given a guided tour of the facility and gained insight into the various resources and services it offers.



Additionally, the Foundation was officially invited to participate in the Library's 70th anniversary celebration.

On 29 January, I attended the 70th-anniversary celebration alongside Micah Chingaya, Volunteer Coordinator. This event not only marked a momentous occasion for the library but also signified the beginning of a valuable partnership between the Michael Daniel Bam Foundation and Cape Town Central Library.



Project Plýsi

Through our discussions with the library and its staff, the idea of Project Plýsi was born. This initiative aims to utilise the library as a hub for distributing care packages containing essential hygiene and wellbeing items to individuals in need.

Recognising the library's role as a trusted and accessible community space, we saw an opportunity to provide support in a dignified and structured manner.

Plýsi, meaning 'to cleanse' in Greek.







Progress Through Technology

February



February was a month of significant growth and progress, as we worked to strengthen and solidify key partnerships that will greatly enhance the Foundation's ability to serve communities more effectively. These collaborations will not only expand our reach but also ensure provide that we can more sustainable and impactful support to those in need. By fostering these relationships, we are laying the groundwork for long-term initiatives that will drive meaningful change.

February

On 3 February, I received confirmation from Techold Engineering, a Zimbabwean engineering company, that they have agreed to partner with the Foundation and sponsor 50% of Project Eudaimonia: Christmas 2025. This marks a significant step forward in securing long-term sustainability for one of our flagship projects.

On 6 February, we officially launched the Project Eudaimonia Easter campaign, which is set to take place on 13 April. This initiative will provide meals and support to those in need during the Easter period, continuing our mission of uplifting communities through nourishment and care.

Further support for Project Eudaimonia came on 10 February when local artist OKAJ partnered with the Foundation and pledged to sponsor 50 meals.

On 14 February, I met once again with Rosalind Hendricks and Razaan Khan at the Cape Town Central Library to confirm that Project Plýsi will be trialed during Human Rights Week, taking place from 17 to 23 March. This confirmation marked a critical step in implementing the project and ensuring it can effectively serve those in need.

On 19 February, I finalised the Public Benefit Organisation (PBO) application with SARS.



March

March was an exciting month of both significant milestones and project execution, marked by key developments for the Foundation. As we continued to work on our initiatives, we saw notable progress in both our outreach and impact.



On 1 March at the Cape Town Civic Centre, I was officially sworn into the Cape Town Junior City Council. The Cape Town Junior City Council provides a valuable platform for amplifying the mission and impact of the Foundation. Through this role, I will have the opportunity to engage with fellow young leaders, city officials, and community stakeholders.

On 7 March, I collected sponsored shampoo from Coiffure Ezra. marking the beginning of a potential partnership with long-term salon. Their generous contribution support Project Plýsi will and reinforce the importance of community-driven collaborations in ensuring access to essential hygiene products.





On 12 March, the hygiene parcels for Project Plýsi were packed and prepared. Additionally, we held a team meeting, during which Micah and Leo officially joined the team, signing their volunteer service agreements.

On 13 March, I was invited to deliver a speech at the Central Library's Human Rights Day event on 20 March.

On 20 March, I attended and spoke at an event hosted at Cape Town Central Library, where I delivered a speech on human rights, focusing specifically on the right to dignity.

On 24 March, I had a phone call with Roman Ross of Ross Printz to discuss T-shirt printing prices and explore the possibility of Ross Printz becoming the Foundation's official merchandise printing partner.

On 25 March, I met with Roman Ross in person and handed over a demo shirt to be printed on. This meeting allowed me to test the quality and potential of Ross Printz's printing capabilities firsthand.

On 26 March, I met with Roman again and received the printed Tshirt. The print was of top quality, and we agreed that Ross Printz would become the Foundation's merchandise printing partner, offering a reduced price per print. I also launched the Foundation's merchandise on social media and other platforms - an exciting milestone as we began selling our first batch of T-shirts to support the sustainability of our projects and the foundation overall.

On 27 March, all shirts in stock were sold out, bringing in a profit of just over R800 for the Foundation. This marked a strong start to our merchandise initiative and a meaningful contribution toward funding our ongoing projects.

On 31 March, we held our final team meeting for the quarter. This meeting consisted of a reflection on the past quarter and planning for the upcoming quarter





Closing Remarks

Reflecting on this past quarter, I'm proud of how far we've come. From Project Eudaimonia growing launching Project Plýsi, we've made meaningful strides in uplifting others and creating real impact. I'm incredibly proud to end this quarter with a milestone - having completed our Easter fundraising for **Project** Eudaimonia, the Foundation has now raised just over R30,000 over the past year. I'm truly honoured to continue this work and blessed to serve our communities in the spirit of rising by lifting others. A heartfelt thank you to everyone who has walked this journey with me - partners, volunteers, donors, and supporters. Your belief in the vision makes all the difference.

As we move into the next quarter, I'm filled with excitement and hope for what lies ahead. I look forward to continuing to serve our communities with dedication and heart, and to deepening the impact of both Project Eudaimonia and Project Plýsi. This new season brings fresh opportunities to build meaningful partnerships, grow our reach, and create lasting change for those who need it most.
